- School generated funds raised and collected by the school or broader community, including local school initiatives, school council/student council and donations to school are considered board funds.
- All funds must be used for *direct* benefit of students

- Non- KPR employees must not purchase items for reimbursement
- Fundraising Plan must be developed by the council by end of October and funds should be used within the school year, except when funding for larger items/projects
- Lotteries and Games of Chance long application process check with municipality, new license for each event must be applied for.
- Can now accept online donations through School Cash Online received and automatically deposited. Anyone can donate.
- Donors can choose specific initiatives such as non-designated, nutrition, playground, music and other (can be specified)
- School Councils Ministry Funds
 – each school automatically gets \$500 for parent outreach activities to be spent by the school council by the end of the school year.
